4. Financial Issues

A. IU Budget for 2021-22

The IU Budget for 2021-22 was approved.

B. Nutrition Group Cost Reimbursement Contract

The 2021-22 Food Service Management Renewal Year Cost Reimbursable Contract Budget with The Nutrition Group was approved.

C. Vendor for Elementary School HVAC Upgrade Project

Huckstein Mechanical Services, Inc. was approved as the vendor for upgrades to the elementary school's HVAC system pursuant to the COSTARS cooperative purchasing program.

D. Issuance of New Money and Refinancing of Eligible Debt

The Board authorized the Administration to work with PFM Financial Advisors, Dinsmore & Shohl Bond Counsel, and the Solicitor for the issuance of the General Obligation Series of 2021 for the purposes of refinancing all or a portion of the District Series of 2013, 2015A, and 2015B Bonds and to provide for a construction fund deposit of \$1,688,185.

B. Cooperative School Nurse Practicum Affiliation Agreement

The Board approved a Cooperative School Nurse Practicum Affiliation Agreement with Eastern University to permit Jessica McKissick placement while she is enrolled in the Certified School Nurse Practicum Program during the 2020-21 term.

C. IU IV Board Nomination

Mrs. Karen Houk was nominated for re-election to the IU IV Board of Directors for a three-year term effective July 1, 2021, through June 30, 2024.

D. IU IV Intergovernmental Agreement

An Intergovernmental Agreement with IU IV to provide and operate special education services and programs for the 2021-22 school term was approved.

E. IU IV Continued Services

The Board approved a listing of contracted Midwestern Intermediate Unit IV Special Education Itinerant Services for the 2021-22 school year. These services include OT/PT, Hearing Support, Vision Support, O & M Support, Feeding and Swallowing Services, and Adaptive Physical Education.
