It is a great pleasure to welcome you back to school. We are committed to daily instruction and support to provide a learning environment with attention to individual needs. I encourage you to remain involved in the process and communicate your needs or questions to teachers as they arise. We will do all we can to help and support you and your child.

All courses in Grades K-12 have an electronic platform which includes up-to-date instructional materials and resources. Students will be receiving a Chromebook during the first week of school. The Chromebooks will be used as a resource tool and for students to connect to their electronic classroom. Specific details on Chromebooks and technology procedures are included in this packet. Additionally, we offer a full-time cyber school, Neshannock Online Campus. You will be receiving transportation information directly from our Transportation Department. It will have specific times for your child(ren). If you do not receive a notice by August 25, please contact the Transportation Office at (724) 654-2560. Please understand that transporting students is a challenging undertaking. The precision of the times will require some patience during the first weeks of school. Once a routine is in place, our drivers are very good at consistent timing both in the morning and afternoon. As always, our bus garage will be accessible to parents with questions or concerns.

In the event of an announcement, we will continue to use our electronic messaging system to reach families. You may register for text message alerts to receive information via text. We will also use the District website www.ntsd.org to post information related to all school events and activities. We post information to the website in a timely and on-going manner. Please check the website often for information you may need related to any aspect of the School District. We also regularly post information to the District's Facebook (@neshtsd) and Instagram (@neshannock.lancers) pages. Please consider following us to receive District information.

Dear Parent/Guardian:

Children need healthy meals to learn. Neshannock Township School District offers healthy meals every school day. Breakfast costs \$1.00; lunch costs \$2.25 (Grades PreK-12) and \$2.50 (Grades 7-12). Your child(ren) may qualify for free meals or for reduced price meals. Reduced price is \$0.30 for breakfast and \$0.40 for lunch. This packet includes an application for free and reduced price meal benefits, and a set of detailed instructions. Below are some common questions and answers to help you with the application process.

If you have received a **NOTICE OF DIRECT CERTIFICATION** letter for free meals, **do not** complete the application. But **do** let the school know if any children in your household are not listed on the **NOTICE OF DIRECT CERTIFICATION** letter you received.

- WHO CAN GET FREE OR REDUCED PRICE MEALS OR SPECIAL MILK?
 - All children in households receiving Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) (formerly the Food Stamp Program) or Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) benefits are eligible for free meals.
 - Foster children who are under the legal responsibility of a foster care agency or court are eligible for free meals.
 - Children participating in their school's Head Start program are eligible for free meals.
 - Children who meet the definition of homeless, runaway, or migrant are eligible for free meals.
 - Children may receive free or reduced price meals if your household's income is within the limits on the Federal Income Eligibility Guidelines. Your children may qualify for free or reduced price meals if your household income falls at or below the limits on this chart.

- 2. HOW DO I KNOW IF MY CHILDREN QUALIFY AS HOMELESS, MIGRANT, OR RUNAWAY? Do the members of your household lack a permanent address? Are you staying together in a shelter, hotel, or other temporary housing arrangement? Does your family relocate on a seasonal basis? Are any children living with you who have chosen to leave their prior family or household? If you believe children in your household meet these descriptions and haven't been told your children will get free meals, call or email Mrs. Staci Norris at snorris@ntsd.org or 724-658-4793, ext. 5106.
- 3. DO I NEED TO FILL OUT AN APPLICATION FOR EACH CHILD? No. Use one Free and Reduced Price School Meals Application for all students in your household. We cannot approve an application that is not complete, so be sure to fill out all required information. - 4. SHOULD I FILL OUT AN APPLICATION IF I RECEIVED A LETTER THIS SCHOOL YEAR SAYING MY CHILDREN ARE ALREADY APPROVED FOR FREE MEALS? No, but read the letter you received carefully and follow the instructions. If any children in your household were missing from your eligibility notification letter, contact Mrs. Jenny Flannery, 3834 Mitchell Road, New Castle, PA 16105 | 724-658-4793, ext. 5103 | jflannery@ntsd.org immediately.
- 5. CAN I APPLY ONLINE? Yes! You are encouraged to complete an online application instead of a paper application if you are able. The online application has the same requirements and will ask you for the same information as the paper application. Visit https://www.ntsd.org/departments/cafeteria/ or visit the PA Department of Human Services website at www.compass.state.pa.us.
- 6. MY CHILD'S APPLICATION WAS APPROVED LAST YEAR. DO I NEED TO FILL OUT A NEW ONE? Yes. Your child's application is only good for that school year and for the first 30 operating school days of this school year. You must send in a new application unless the school told you that your child is eligible for the new school year.
- 7. I GET WIC. CAN MY CHILDREN GET FREE MEALS? Children in households participating in WIC <u>may</u> be eligible for free or reduced price meals. Send in an application.
- 8. WILL THE INFORMATION I GIVE BE CHECKED? Yes. We may also ask you to send written proof of the household income you report.

- 9. IF I DON'T QUALIFY NOW, MAY I APPLY LATER? Yes, you may apply at any time during the school year. For example, children with a parent or guardian who becomes unemployed may become eligible for free and/or reduced price meals if the household income drops below the income limit.
- 10. WHAT IF I DISAGREE WITH THE SCHOOL'S DECISION ABOUT MY APPLICATION? You should talk to school officials. You also may ask for a hearing by calling or writing to: **Dr. Terence P. Meehan, 3834 Mitchell Road, New Castle, PA 16105** | tmeehan@ntsd.org | 724-658-4793.
- 11. MAY I APPLY IF SOMEONE IN MY HOUSEHOLD IS NOT A U.S. CITIZEN? Yes. You, your children, or other household members do not have to be U.S. citizens to apply for free or reduced price meals.
- 12. WHAT IF MY INCOME IS NOT ALWAYS THE SAME? List the amount that you <u>normally</u> receive. For example, if you normally make \$1000 each month, but you missed some work last month and only made \$900, put down that you made \$1000 per month. If you normally get overtime, include it, but do not include it if you only work overtime sometimes. If you have lost a job or had your hours or wages reduced, use your current income.
- 13. WHAT IF SOME HOUSEHOLD MEMBERS HAVE NO INCOME TO REPORT? Household members may not receive some types of income we ask you to report on the application or may not receive income at all. Whenever this happens, write a 0 in the field. However, if any income fields are left empty or blank, those will also be counted as zeroes. Be careful when leaving income fields blank, as we will assume you meant to do so.
- 14. WE ARE IN THE MILITARY. DO WE REPORT OUR INCOME DIFFERENTLY? Your basic pay and cash bonuses must be reported as income. If you get any cash value allowances for off-base housing, food, or clothing, or receive Family Subsistence Supplemental Allowance payments, it must also be included as income. However, if your housing is part of the Military Housing Privatization Initiative, do not include your housing allowance as income. Any additional combat pay resulting from deployment is also excluded from income.
- 15. WHAT IF THERE ISN'T ENOUGH SPACE ON THE APPLICATION FOR MY FAMILY? List any additional household members on a separate piece of paper and attach it to your application. Contact Mrs. Jenny Flannery | 724-658-4793, ext. 5103 | jflannery@ntsd.org to receive a second application.
- 16. MY FAMILY NEEDS MORE HELP. ARE THERE OTHER PROGRAMS WE MIGHT APPLY FOR? To find out how to apply for **SNAP** or other assistance benefits, visit www.compass.state.pa.us, contact your local county assistance office, or call 1-800-692-7462.

Neshannock Township School District is proud to share information about our Special Education Department and the delivery of a full continuum of services and programs to our students.

Our District's goal is to provide appropriate programs and services for students with disabilities by facilitating collaborative efforts among parents, teachers, students, therapists, administrators, and other support personnel.

Your child may qualify for an Individualized Educational Plan. IEP is a plan or program developed to ensure that a child who has a disability identified under the law and is attending an elementary or secondary educational institution, receives specialized instruction and related services. The IEP teams make decisions about levels of intervention; goals, accommodations, modifications and specially designed instruction based on each student's individual needs. We follow federal and state regulations and the assertion that students will be provided support and services in a least restrictive environment. Our staff including teachers, therapists, and paraprofessionals deliver these services in typical settings with non-disabled peers to the greatest extent appropriate.

A student that does not qualify for special education services under IDEA (an educational law) still may qualify for services under Section 504 (a civil rights law) if the disability is shown to substantially limit his or her educational performance.

A child with a disability is one who has a physical or mental impairment that substantially limits major life activities, such as caring for one's self, performing manual tasks, walking, seeing, hearing, speaking, breathing, learning and working. Accommodations often refer to building accessibility, classroom adjustments and curriculum modifications and may be updated or revised as the need changes.



- As soon as all, kindergartners and first graders are picked up, SECOND GRADE PARENTS will be directed to drive to the lower lot - approximately 3:15 PM.
- Please display your YELLOW sign on the right side of your windshield, or the passenger side window.


NOTES FOR STUDENT PICK-UP

The average third grader should be able to recognize his/her car and read his/her last name on the green sign. We will assist the children in getting to their cars, but our goal is to train each student to look for and recognize their ride.
- Once you have your child, safely drive away.
- We are not sure how long this process will take, but safety is our first concern. Your patience is greatly appreciated.

Fourth, Fifth, and Sixth Grade Pick-Up

- Dismissal for Grades 4-6 is scheduled for 3:25 PM.
- All parents for 4-6 graders will pick up their children in the back of the school. Parents may park in the lower or upper parking lots to pick up their children.

LEARNING PLATFORM

Google Classroom will be utilized as the online learning platform for our students in Grades K-6.

SYNCHRONOUS INSTRUCTION

LIVE INTERACTION

Our K-6 Cyber Teacher, Miss Lexie Ferrese, is dedicated exclusively to cyber instruction. She will schedule a daily live instruction session with each grade level. Not only will students get to interact with the teacher, but they will also get to interact with their virtual peers during these sessions.

Mrs. Alexandra Morrone will work alongside Miss Ferrese as our K-6 Cyber Aide. She will be able to provide live support, reteaching, and remediation to cyber students as needed.

Daily live sessions are <u>required</u> in order to be marked as present. Live sessions will not be recorded.

ASYNCHRONOUS INSTRUCTION

PRE-RECORDED INSTRUCTION

Miss Ferrese will post learning materials and prerecorded instructional videos for ELA and Math each day, as well as additional subjects as appropriate. These videos will be provided by the in-person grade level teachers to ensure continuity of instruction among cyber and in-person students. Students are encouraged to make every effort to watch the ELA and Math videos prior to their respective live sessions.

PRACTICAL ARTS

Students will have Art, Computers, Library, Music, and Physical Education and Wellness class each week. Special subjects are required and students will be expected to complete tasks for one special subject class per day.

FLEXIBLE LEARNING

All learning materials, such as instructional videos and assignments, will be posted at 8:00 am each day. Students must submit completed work by 8:00 pm each day. Aside from scheduled live (required) sessions, students will have the flexibility to access and complete learning materials any time within this 12-hour window.

ACCESSING EMAIL



All students are assigned an "@ntsd.org" email address. This email address is made up of the student's first initial, last name, and last two digits of his/her intended graduation year. For instance, an incoming kindergarten student named John Smith would have an email address of jsmith34@ntsd.org.

Students new to the District, including kindergarten students, will receive their email addresses and passwords with their virtual supply bundles on August 24. Previously enrolled students entering Grades 1-6 will utilize the same email address and password as the 2021-2022 school year. The technology department requests that you **do not** change your child's password. To access student email, visit mail.google.com and then follow the prompts to enter the email address and password.

ACCESSING GOOGLE CLASSROOM



A student must be logged in to his/her @ntsd.org email address in order to access to Google Classroom. The Google Classroom can then be accessed by clicking on the "Google Waffle" at the top right of your email inbox screen. The "Google Waffle" is the grid of nine small gray boxes that you find in the top right corner of your browser when you are using Gmail, Google Drive, Google Classroom, etc. Then, proceed with the following steps:

- Hover the mouse over the "waffle" for a second or two, and the words "Google Apps" will appear.
- Click on the "waffle" to access the apps.
- Click on the green and yellow icon that says "Google Classroom."
- Once in "Google Classroom," click on the small plus sign in the upper right corner – select "Join Class."
- Type in the class code provided by the cyber teacher. It will be a short series of letters and/or numbers.

LOGGING ON TO SCHOOLOGY

COURSE DASHBOARD



The course dashboard home page allows you to view each of your courses in a tiled list. This tutorial will orient you with the layout of this page, navigation options, and features. Syncing your Google Drive is also covered in this tutorial!

MATERIALS



Our teachers will post a variety of course material types. This video will show you an example course layout, familiarize you with the types of materials, and review the most effective ways to navigate through course materials.

ASSIGNMENTS

Assignments are a common material type used in Schoology. They may be distributed through Google Drive templates (similar to Google Classroom) or require you to submit a file that you have created. This video will cover both assignment types and how to view assignment scores and feedback.

ASSESSMENTS



Assessments are another common material type used within Schoology. This video covers the layout of a Schoology assessment as well as common question types, submitting your work, and reviewing scores and feedback.

Note: Full grade reporting will be done via GoEdustar.

MOBILE APP

Although it is not a requirement, students may wish to install the Schoology mobile app on their phones and/or tablets. This video will cover installing the app and logging on. Important: Some functions of Schoology are limited within the app.
